Preface – Commitment to Sustainability

SQS has been active in the field of sustainability for many years and in many respects. It is a tradition and is deeply rooted in the values we live by. Particularly well known is its activity in the field of sustainability-relevant management systems. It thereby helps companies and organisations to gain recognised performance through assessment and certification. Based on future-oriented entrepreneurial sustainability, in which relevant performance improvements, risk-based thinking, opportunity utilization, cooperation, etc., are of prime importance and higher demands on social benefits are to be used as a guideline. The SQS is thus focusing on young people's enthusiasm for environmentally relevant and social aspects of sustainability and acknowledges this in the award ceremony with the winners.

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Importance of biological diversity from the SQS perspective

We take sustainability seriously! Sustainability is an important issue for SQS in many respects: on the one hand, it is regarded as an important driver of our corporate development and, on the other, our own sustainable development is anchored in the SQS corporate strategy. The most important basis for human well-being is the conservation and sustainable use of biological diversity. It has been proven that our nature will only function thanks to a high level of biological diversity. Biodiversity is the driving force and secures our own livelihoods: plants, animals, fertile soils, etc. The effects of the hazards and the already existing damage to biodiversity ultimately affect society, the economy and the environment alike. The necessary protection and conservation of biodiversity is undoubtedly a complex matter and is increasingly proving to be an enormous challenge for the future. Biodiversity is also linked to other major challenges facing society in terms of protecting the environment and natural resources, fighting climate change, ensuring fair livelihoods and a realistic standard of living for future generations. Objectives and principles can be found i.a. in the UN Sustainability Goals 2030, the initiatives and measures for climate protection, resource efficiency including "Circular Economy" efforts.

Why do we need biodiversity – a mission for schoolchildren and young people?

Natural diversity is the ultimate basis of livelihood: first, for us humans, because we live on air, water and food – and then, we use nature for a variety of purposes. But genetic diversity is also vital for the survival of plant- and animal species in order to adapt to changing environmental conditions.

Students between the ages of 6 and 16 have been given the task of putting their personal drawings of the "Wealth of Nature" on paper. They are to interpret the subject of "biodiversity" in a colourful illustration. Painting is the mouthpiece of the students and the works of art should make you think. The drawings are divided into three categories. In 2019, a total of 2 394 drawings from 168 Swiss schools were submitted:

Category 6 to 9 Years = 493 drawings
Category 10 to 12 Years = 1161 drawings
Category 13 to 16 Years = 740 drawings

The winners have received a sum of between CHF 750.00 and CHF 2 000.00 in the class funds. The money is to be used for a school trip, a project or an activity that deals with an environmental topic.

The funny little dragon makes the mood and the elephant doesn't lose sight of the target. The bright group sits in the same boat and sails towards the sun. Where do they come from and where does it drive them? Good courage seems to be there!

Interpretation of the artwork by Barbara Baumann, Painting- and Showroom Worb: Please get in!

The boat inevitably reminds of Noah's Ark (or, of course, of the refugee boats on the oceans). But it is not the ark. There is only one species in the boat (except the ladybirds...) and always new species are allowed on board. As many as possible! But the animals do not seem to be afraid, it is probably not a lifeboat. Rather an adventurous excursion boat. The journey into the future seems to make everyone happy. All animals have the same round eyes, which look around a little astonished or curious. Where do they go? What does the journey bring? The relaxed way of painting is atmospheric and results in a cordial lightheartedness, which the viewer gladly takes over.
